DAVID EDMONDS currently serves as Director of Choral Studies at the University of New Mexico where he directs the Concert Choir and teaches undergraduate and graduate conducting and choral repertoire. Before coming to UNM Dr. Edmonds was Director of Choral Activities at the University of Montana for six years where he led the UM Chamber Chorale to their first-ever invitations to perform for both the NAfME NW and NWACDA Conferences. An advocate for students and pre-service teachers, Edmonds just completed a six-year appointment as ACDA National Repertoire & Resources Chair for Student Activities, working on the R&R team to create programming and initiatives supporting the ACDA national student membership. His original compositions and arrangements are published with Alliance, Colla Voce, and MorningStar Music Publishers. He lives in New Mexico with his incredible wife and their two (often) well-behaved daughters.

PATRICK DILL is the newly appointed visiting assistant professor of choral music education at the University of New Mexico, and was most recently the director of choral activities and choral music education at Central Methodist University. Choirs under his direction have performed at multiple state and regional ACDA and music education conferences, and Dr. Dill has an active schedule as a clinician, arranger, and adjudicator. Additionally, he served as the repertoire and resource chair for college and university choirs with the Missouri Choral Directors Association and was a state board member for the MO chapter of the Society for Music Teacher Education. He now lives in New Mexico with his musicologist husband and their two daughters, the harpist and the singer.

SHAREE GARIETY grew up in California singing at home and in choirs from an early age. After graduating with a BA in Music from Brigham Young University, she and her husband, Arthur, moved to Albuquerque where they have resided and raised their seven children for twenty years. Sharee tries to stay involved in the arts in her community as often as time allows, and in addition to directing church and community choirs of all ages, has performed locally with the NM Bach Society, Opera Unlimited, Quintessence, Albuquerque Little Theatre, and Music Theatre Southwest. For the past 15 years, Sharee has directed an annual Children's Music Theatre summer camp through her LLC, Young Performing Artists of ABQ. Having recently completed a master's degree in Choral Conducting from the University of New Mexico, Sharee currently directs the UNM Las Cantantes and the UNM Children's Chorus through the

Music Prep School. Sharee has enjoyed working with middle and high school choir programs in Albuquerque and Rio Rancho as a clinician, adjudicator, and guest conductor.

CAMILLE KELLY, an Albuquerque native, received a Bachelor of Music Education from the University of New Mexico and co-founded/directed the UNM Lobo Men's Chorus while still a student. After graduation, Ms. Kelly was the chorus and general music teacher at the Montessori Elementary Fine Arts Charter where she founded the 4th and 5th grade chorus of 100 members and the middle school chorus. In the fall of 2016, Ms. Kelly accepted the position to be the Director of Choral Activities in the Jackson County School District in Southern Oregon. In 2019, Ms. Kelly returned to New Mexico and is now the director of Choral and Piano Activities at Del Norte High School. Ms. Kelly regularly serves as clinician and adjudicator for both middle school and high school choral events and competitions around the state. In 2021, she was honored to be the clinician for the Rio Rancho Middle School Honor Choir. Ms. Kelly is excited to return to the University of New Mexico as the adjunct professor for the "Something Major A Cappella" and "Honeychords" ensembles.

NATASHA STOJANOVSKA, Macedonian pianist and composer, recently released her debut album with Navona Records, PARMA Recordings: "Uncommon Voices" exploring music by Eastern European Women Composers and a new album "Uncommon Voices, Part II: American Women Composers" which have already received outstanding reviews by Take Effect, Music Web, and Sequenza21. Some of Ms. Stojanovska's most recent projects and performances include the Princeton and Ear Taxi Music Festivals as well as the Dame Myra Hess Memorial Concerts, IU South Bend Piano Series and Chatter/Ensemble Music New Mexico. Ms. Stojanovska completed her Doctor of Musical Arts at The Bienen School of Music, Northwestern University, Chicago IL in the studio of James Giles. She received her Artist Diploma and Master of Music in Piano Performance from Indiana University South Bend with Alexander Toradze and Ketevan Badridze; Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance from Lynn University, Conservatory of Music with Roberta Rust. In Europe she studied with Todor Svetiev and Margareta Tatarchevska. Ms. Stojanovska has performed solo and chamber music recitals in France, Portugal, Macedonia, Serbia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Romania, South Korea, Haiti, and the United States. Natasha and her sister Marina have formed the piano duo Sisters Stojanovska and perform all around the globe.

ALLY McCurley is the student director of UNM's a capella ensemble SMAC. After four years of teaching general music in Albuquerque Public Schools, she is now the new upper school music teacher at Manzano Day School. She received both a Bachelor's and Master's degree from UNM in Music Education and is very passionate about making music accessible and engaging for all.

NATHAN CLEAVELAND is the Choral Studies TA at the University of New Mexico and the graduate assistant conductor of the UNM Concert Choir. He earned a Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance from St. Olaf College, where he also studied organ and church music. He held the position of Organist & Choirmaster for two years at All Saints Episcopal Church in Northfield, MN, before moving to Albuquerque in 2020 and securing the organist job at All Saints Lutheran Church. He is currently pursuing a Master of Music degree in Choral Conducting under the guidance of Dr. David Edmonds.

SPENSER LOTZ holds two degrees from the University of New Mexico: a BA in Music and a JD. During his percussion career, Spenser was a marching band tech for APS and a TA for steel band at the Albuquerque Academy. He briefly studied arts administration and worked in the nonprofit sector before pivoting to practice law. Now, he works for the State of New Mexico doing environmental law, but still tries to find time to play and perform wherever possible.
