DAVID EDMONDS, D.M.A, is Director of Choral Studies at the University of New Mexico where he directs the UNM Concert Choir and teaches undergraduate and graduate conducting and choral repertoire. He also serves as Artistic Director and Conductor of Dolce Canto, a community-based choir in Missoula, Montana, and recently led the New Mexico Symphonic Chorus for their 2023-2024 season as Interim Artistic Director. Edmonds was ACDA National Repertoire & Resources Chair for Student Activities from 2015-2021, helping support ACDA student membership nation-wide. He obtained advanced degrees in conducting from the University of North Texas (D.M.A., '12) and Westminster Choir College (M.M., '10) after teaching high school choral music for six years in Iowa and Texas. His compositions are published by Alliance, Colla Voce, and MorningStar Music Publishers. Dr. Edmonds lives in New Mexico with his incredible wife and their two (often) well-behaved daughters.

PATRICK DILL is the newly appointed visiting assistant professor of choral music education at the University of New Mexico and was most recently the director of choral activities and choral music education at Central Methodist University. Choirs under his direction have performed at multiple state and regional ACDA and music education conferences, and Dr. Dill has an active schedule as a clinician, arranger, and adjudicator. Additionally, he served as the repertoire and resource chair for college and university choirs with the Missouri Choral Directors Association and was a state board member for the MO chapter of the Society for Music Teacher Education. He now lives in New Mexico with his musicologist husband and their two daughters, the harpist and the singer.

SHAREE GARIETY grew up in California singing at home and in choirs from an early age. After graduating with a BA in Music from Brigham Young University, she and her husband, Arthur, moved to Albuquerque where they have resided and raised their seven children for twenty years. Sharee tries to stay involved in the arts in her community as often as time allows, and in addition to directing church and community choirs of all ages, has performed locally with the NM Bach Society, Opera Unlimited, Quintessence, Albuquerque Little Theatre, and Music Theatre Southwest. For the past 15 years, Sharee has directed an annual

Children's Music Theatre summer camp through her LLC, Young Performing Artists of ABQ. Having recently completed a master's degree in Choral Conducting from the University of New Mexico, Sharee currently directs the UNM Las Cantantes and the UNM Children's Chorus through the Music Prep School. Sharee has enjoyed working with middle and high school choir programs in Albuquerque and Rio Rancho as a clinician, adjudicator, and guest conductor.

STEVIE DEJUAN SPRINGER is a native of New York City by way of Texas, and now resides in New Mexico. He earned a Bachelor's in Fine Arts from Huston-Tillotson University, a Masters in Music from the University of New Mexico, and a PhD from the University of the Southwest with a focus in Chronic Pain/Occupational Therapy and a PhD and Medical degree from Quantum University. He currently hosts a Medical/Wellness show on KRQE-TV (Fox), titled "Wise and Well with Dr. Stevie DeJuan Springer." Dr. Springer has a private music academy, and is adjunct faculty at the University of New Mexico, where he leads the UNM Gospel Choir.

NATASHA STOJANOVSKA, Macedonian pianist and composer, recently released her debut album with Navona Records, PARMA Recordings: "Uncommon Voices" exploring music by Eastern European Women Composers and a new album "Uncommon Voices, Part II: American Women Composers" which have already received outstanding reviews by Take Effect, Music Web, and Sequenza21. Some of Ms. Stojanovska's most recent projects and performances include the Princeton and Ear Taxi Music Festivals as well as the Dame Myra Hess Memorial Concerts, IU South Bend Piano Series and Chatter/Ensemble Music New Mexico. Ms. Stojanovska completed her Doctor of Musical Arts at The Bienen School of Music, Northwestern University, Chicago IL in the studio of James Giles. She received her Artist Diploma and Master of Music in Piano Performance from Indiana University South Bend with Alexander Toradze and Ketevan Badridze; Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance from Lynn University, Conservatory of Music with Roberta Rust. In Europe she studied with Todor Svetiev and Margareta Tatarchevska. Ms. Stojanovska has performed solo and

chamber music recitals in France, Portugal, Macedonia, Serbia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Romania, South Korea, Haiti, and the United States. Natasha and her sister Marina have formed the piano duo Sisters Stojanovska and perform all around the globe.

TATIANA SHUSTOVA is originally from Saint Petersburg, Russia, where she studied at the Rimsky-Korsakov State Conservatory with Yaroslav Pugach. After coming to the United States in 2005, Tatiana completed the Artist's Certificate Program and a Master's degree in piano performance at Bowling Green State University in Ohio. There she studied with Maxim Mogilevsky and Dr. Robert Satterlee and won first prize in the 40th annual Concerto Competition. In 2008 she was awarded a fellowship to enter the doctoral program in piano performance at the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, in the studio of Dr. Ian Hobson, and received her DMA in Spring 2013. Dr. Shustova is currently an adjunct music faculty member at The University of New Mexico. Prior to that she held music faculty positions at Millikin University School of Music and School of Music at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. In addition, she is president of the World Piano Teachers Association, Illinois Chapter.

NATHAN CLEAVELAND is the Choral Studies TA at the University of New Mexico and the graduate assistant conductor of the UNM Concert Choir. He earned a Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance from St. Olaf College, where he also studied organ and church music. He held the position of Organist & Choirmaster for two years at All Saints Episcopal Church in Northfield, MN, before moving to Albuquerque in 2020 and securing the organist job at All Saints Lutheran Church. He is currently pursuing a Master of Music degree in Choral Conducting under the guidance of Dr. David Edmonds.
